Locate and represent these numbers on a number line • Comprehend the size and order of small to 1000'ths and large numbers to 1,000,000's • Use number expanders to read, record 4, 5 and 6 digit numbers • Place integers, decimals, negative numbers and common fractions on a number line • Build in the additional place value aspects, numbers are grouped in hundreds, tens and ones of thousands, millions, billions and so on as numbers are extended beyond 6 digits. • Identify and describe properties of prime, composite, square and triangular numbers • Investigate everyday situations that use integers. Locate and represent these numbers on a number line • Recognise that integers form an ordered infinite set with no first or last element (arrows on a numberline to show there is no end) • Make connections between equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages • Find a simple fraction of a quantity where the result is a whole number, with and without digital technologies • Compare fractions with related denominators and relate and represent them on a number line • Demonstrate equivalence between fractions using drawings and models • Make connections between equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages • Compare and order decimal fractions with unequal number of places • Counting patterns in decimal fractions • Continue and create sequences involving whole numbers, fractions and decimals. Describe the rule used to create the sequence • Connect decimal representation to the metric system 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use CAFE strategies to improve reading • use VOICES strategies to improve reading • write persuasive texts • write a variety of personal texts using a writing ideas booklet and writer's notebook • improve speaking & listening skills through class meetings and other activities • use effective grammar and punctuation to enhance writing

Homework	<p>Reading- 20 minutes reading a night is to be recorded in the students' diary with the headings: title, pages read and time spent reading. Recordings are to be signed by parents if possible every day. A range of literature is available in classrooms and our library. Local library visits and reading of a variety of texts-e.g. newspapers and online reports is encouraged.</p> <p>Mathletics- A minimum of 2 tasks related to class content will be assigned by class teachers each week. Students are expected to complete these tasks on a weekly basis. Each student has a student login username and password. Activities offer both challenge and reinforcement of concepts.</p> <p>Additional homework will be related to our classroom focus over a weekly or fortnightly timeframe.</p> <p>Diaries are to be submitted every Friday to the class teacher and when there is communication from home.</p>			
Nude food lunches	All students are encouraged to bring 'nude food' lunches. A nude food lunch has no foil, gladwrap or any other packaging. Please unwrap and throw any rubbish out at home to help us significantly reduce the amount of rubbish scattered throughout our school. Your child needs to be able to manage the opening and closing of lunch containers independently. A labelled drink bottle containing water is highly encouraged. Research shows that children learn best when they are hydrated with water.			
School Uniform	<p>Our Beaumaris PS school uniform should be worn correctly and be in good condition. Please ensure all items of clothing are named and check the lost property cupboard near the art room for any missing items.</p> <p>Please ensure hair longer than shoulder length is tied up and hair accessories are school colours only. Jewellery is not part of the Beaumaris PS school uniform including coloured wrist and ankle bands. Students may only wear small stud earrings. School uniform is worn on excursions.</p>

If you have a specific concern that will take more than a few minutes, please make an appointment with the class teacher. All teachers are required at staff meetings and professional development sessions every Monday and Wednesday from 3.45pm and briefings 8:40 – 8:50am, so we would appreciate if appointments can be made at other times.</p>
