Homework	<p>Homework is sent home Monday and due back Friday, unless otherwise stated.</p> <p>Homework will consist mainly of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *daily reading to promote appreciation of different texts and authors and build on students' confidence in their reading ability *practise of mental math to improve student proficiency in making calculations in their minds *tasks to investigate or apply knowledge related to all learning. <p>Homework will generally not exceed 30 minutes per day.</p> <p>Tips: Listening to your child read at home is a good way of supporting your child's reading. Talk about books, read together and make reading an enjoyable, shared activity. We encourage you to play a variety of spelling games with your child to build on word knowledge and spelling skills. We also encourage you to play a variety of number fluency games to help your child build quick recall of addition & subtraction facts to 100 and quick recall of the 2s, 3s, 5s, & 10s multiplication facts and related division facts.</p> <p>Sharing/reflection of the homework task will generally occur in class on the due date of the given task.</p>
Student Diary	<p>Student diaries should be at school every day.</p> <p>Every Friday the teacher will check the reading details for the week.</p>
Birthdays	<p>Children can bring a treat to share on their birthday - No nuts please!</p> <p>A chocolate frog or snake lolly is usually a safe and stress free option.</p>
Nude food lunches	<p>All families are encouraged to prepare nude food lunches. Please unwrap and throw any rubbish out at home to help us reduce the amount of rubbish at school.</p>

School Uniform	<p>Hats are to be worn during recess and lunch until the 1st of May and again from the 1st of September.</p> <p>Jewellery is NOT part of our school uniform. Hair accessories are to be school colours of yellow, blue or white only.</p> <p>Please ensure all items of clothing are named and check the lost property cupboard for any missing items.</p>

Teachers will be outside their classrooms from 3.30pm-3.40pm each day so you can informally catch up with them. If you have a specific concern, please make an appointment with the class teacher.</p> <p>REMINDER: All teachers are in class with their students at 9am and are required at staff briefings each morning from 8.45. Staff meetings and professional development sessions are held every Monday and Wednesday from 3.45pm so please avoid these times.</p>

Premier's Reading Challenge	<p>We are aiming for full school participation therefore we expect that all Year 3 students will be involved. Parent information can be found at http://www.education.vic.gov.au/prc/parents/default.htm</p>
Curriculum	<p>Students will participate in engaging learning experiences related to our fortnightly Statement of Intent. This document is posted on the Year 3 Communication Board and can be accessed online.</p> <p>This term in Numeracy there will be a focus on addition and subtraction, length, mass and chance. The students will also continue to work on building their knowledge of multiplication facts.</p> <p>In Literacy, the students will be involved in a variety of reading experiences to enhance a love of reading and further develop reading comprehension strategies. Our writing focus will be on Persuasive and Information texts. The students will be learning about grammar so they are more able to use language effectively and able to construct interesting and understandable texts. Students will work on spelling activities to develop phonological awareness, graphophonic knowledge, morphemic and etymological knowledge. Students will be supported to further develop speaking and listening behaviours including the skills of articulating knowledge, ideas and thoughts, presentation skills and listening skills.</p> <p>We will continue to build on personal and interpersonal skills through The Resilience Project.</p> <p>This term our subject focus is History. Throughout the term the students will participate in a number of activities, in-school visits and/or excursions that link to our subject focus.</p>
NAPLAN dates	<p>Term 2 Week 4, Tuesday 9th, Wednesday 10th and Thursday 11th of May.</p>
Personalised Learning & Education Research Projects	<p>The classroom communication board plays a vital role in the Year 3-6 area and students are encouraged to view the communication board at the commencement of each day to check for timetabling, subject focus learning intentions, class meeting agenda items, the focus student roster, affirmations, the Statement of Intent and clinic groups.</p> <p>Each morning we begin with tuning-in for the day (15-20mins) where we welcome and highlight the learning for day and have conversations with focus students linked to their learning. At the end of the day we reflect on our learning for the day (5-10mins) and again have conversations with the focus students about their learning.</p> <p>Year 3 students showcase their work related to the current subject focus in the form of an Education Research Project.
