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Homework	<p>Homework is fortnightly being sent home Tuesday and due back Friday week, unless otherwise stated.</p> <p>Homework will consist mainly of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *daily reading to promote appreciation of different texts and authors and build on students' confidence in their reading ability *practise of mental math to improve student proficiency in making calculations in their minds *tasks to investigate or apply knowledge related to all learning. <p>Homework will generally not exceed 30 minutes per day.</p> <p>Tips: Listening to your child read at home is a good way of supporting your child's reading. Talk about books, read together and make reading an enjoyable, shared activity. We encourage you to play a variety of spelling games with your child to build on word knowledge and spelling skills. We also encourage you to play a variety of number fluency games to help your child build quick recall of addition & subtraction facts to 100 and quick recall of the 2s, 3s, 5s, & 10s multiplication facts and related division facts.</p> <p>Sharing/reflection of the homework task will generally occur in class on the due date of the given task.</p>															
Student Diary	Student diaries should be at school every day.															

	<p>Students are required to note home reading in their diaries and any important school events. You may also use the diary as a form of communicate with your teacher, however, important information should be voiced directly to your teacher. The Resilience Project activities should also be completed each night.</p>
Birthdays	<p>Children can bring a treat to share on their birthday - No nuts please!</p>
Nude food lunches	<p>All families are encouraged to prepare nude food lunches. Please unwrap and throw any rubbish out at home to help us reduce the amount of rubbish at school. PLEASE ensure all containers are clearly labelled!</p>
School Uniform	<p>Hats are to be worn during recess and lunch. Jewellery is NOT part of our school uniform. Hair accessories are to be school colours of yellow, blue or white only. Please ensure all items of clothing are named and check the lost property cupboard for any missing items.</p>
Communication	<p>General information and upcoming events are published in <u>Stop Press</u>. A link is emailed out to parents every Thursday or can be accessed via the Beaumaris Primary website. http://www.beaups.vic.edu.au/ Teachers will be outside their classrooms from 3.30pm-3.40pm each day so you can informally catch up with them. If you have a specific concern, please make an appointment with the class teacher. REMINDER: All teachers are in class with their students at 9am and are required at staff briefings each morning from 8.45. Staff meetings and professional development sessions are held every Monday and Wednesday from 3.45pm so please avoid these times.</p>
Absence	<p>To notify us of student absences, either on the day due to illness or in advance for family holidays, parents/guardians are asked to complete a Parent Attendance Note through Compass or ring the school office prior to 8.30am to report their child being absent from school. If neither of these actions is taken before 9.30am on the day of absence our SMS notification system will send out an automatic student absence SMS to the parents of any student marked with an unexplained absence. If your child arrives late to school for any reason, please sign your child in at the office and obtain a Late Arrival Pass. The student will hand this to their classroom teacher. Parents are required to sign their child out at the office and obtain an Early Leavers Pass at the office when collecting a child at any time other than dismissal time. The pass must then be taken to the classroom and given to the teacher, prior to the child being taken from the classroom. Children are not allowed to leave with an adult without a pass.</p>
Curriculum	<p>Students will participate in engaging learning experiences related to our fortnightly learning intentions. The Years 3 & 4 fortnightly Statement of Intent can be accessed online. This term in Numeracy there will be a focus on volume, capacity, area, mass, temperature, symmetry, angles, chance, fractions and decimals. In Literacy, the students will be involved in a variety of reading experiences building reading strategies. Our writing focus will be information, persuasive and narrative texts. We will be conducting class debates built from persuasive writing. Students work on spelling activities to develop phonological awareness, graphophonic knowledge, morphemic and etymological knowledge. As an extension of our Start-Up program we will continue to build on personal and interpersonal skills through the Resilience Project. This term our subject focus is Civics and Citizenship. Throughout the term the students will participate in a number of activities, in-school visits and/or excursions that link to our subject focus.</p>

<p>Personalised Learning & Education Research Projects</p>	<p>The classroom communication board plays a vital role in the Year 3-6 area and students are encouraged to view the communication board at the commencement of each day to check for timetabling, subject focus learning intentions, class meeting agenda items, the focus student roster, affirmations, the Statement of Intent and clinic groups.</p> <p>Each morning we begin with tuning-in for the day (15-20 mins) where we welcome and highlight the learning for day and have conversations with focus students linked to their learning.
